Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them - listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

GOSPEL 9:38-43.45.47-48

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him'. But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION



How do you feel about your faith life? Have there been periods of great growth?

What were they and why do you think they happened?

Have you had periods of little growth in your faith life, times when the well ran dry? Why do you think this happens? How did you get through that period?

When you fail, especially in your faith life, are you able to back up easily? Do you think God judges you as harshly as you judge yourself?

Do you seem to repeat the same failures over and over? What do you learn from your failures?

Can failure ever become a success? Do you think good comes from trying even if you fail?

How do you feel when someone offers you forgiveness without you asking for it? Do you believe that God does the same, or must you seek God's forgiveness?

How hard is it to ask forgiveness from God? from each other?

GOSPEL ACTION

Do you know the Act of Contrition? If not, you can find it in a book of Catholic prayers, or ask a member of the parish staff to give you a copy. Use this prayer as a way to get in touch with your failures, and as a way to seek God's forgiveness. Vow to avoid the near occasions of sin.
